Many original artifacts were donated by the Roosevelt family. Park Ranger-led tours of the rooms allow visitors to enjoy the décor and furnishings of this unique period in the history of decorative arts.

Topics covered will include the Chinese Exclusion Act, McCarthy period, the Red Scare, the Confession program and the House of Un-American Activities Committee. This program is an excellent supplement to students who are studying World War II, the Cold War, US-China relations, and constitutional rights.
